Several got bumped above mayor's salary, and some have left amid federal corruption probes

Some of Mayor Adams' top advisers received pay increases this year that pushed their salaries above his, including David Banks, the since-resigned schools chancellor, whose wage bump made him the highest-paid city government employee over at least the past decade, new payroll data show.

Banks, who stepped down earlier this month in the wake of his home being raided by federal authorities in connection with one of several corruption probes into Adams' administration, saw his annual salary boosted to \$414,799 as part of the wave of wage hikes, the data disclosed Wednesday reveals.

That pay, up 12.5% from the \$363,346 Banks previously collected, made him the highest-paid city employee listed in the municipal government's payroll database, which dates back to fiscal year 2014.

Additionally, the new data show that six of Adams' deputy mayors - including Banks' younger brother, ex-Deputy Mayor for Public Safety Philip Banks, who also resigned this month after being ensnared in a corruption probe - saw their annual salaries jacked up to \$287,663 from \$251,982. Adams' chief adviser Ingrid Lewis-Martin and chief of staff Camille Joseph Varlack saw their pay grades lifted in the same manner.

Former First Deputy Mayor Sheena Wright, who resigned this month after being raided by the feds as well, had her wage go up to \$313,941 this year from her previous \$275,000, per the

The deputy mayors, Lewis-Martin and Varlack all received one-time \$3,000 bonuses this year, too, issued as part of an agreement announced for nonunionized managerial city employees, the data show.



But one city employee who didn't get a raise this year was the mayor himself.

His annual salary has stayed flat at \$258,750 since he became mayor on Jan. 1, 2022, and he didn't collect the \$3,000 bonus this year, either, the data show. That means many members of the mayor's senior staff at City Hall now make more than he does, as do most of his commissioners, who also got 12.5% salary bumps this year, including since-resigned NYPD

Fabien Levy, the deputy mayor for communications, whose salary is now \$287,663, didn't comment Wednesday.

One of Levy's deputies, Liz Garcia, said later in the day that the mayor's salary is set by law and can only be increased via City Charter amendments. She also said city workers in midlevel and junior roles also got 12.5% raises this year under an agreement impacting

managerial and nonunion employees.

It first emerged this past February that Adams was awarding raises to top city government officials, though it wasn't clear at the time exactly who would and wouldn't get them.

The increases came after Adams instituted a since-lifted hiring freeze across nearly all city agencies in fall 2023 due to concerns about the municipal government's finances driven by spending on services for newly arrived migrants.

At the time, Adams said the migrant crisis was putting such a strain on the municipal government's finances that he feared it would "destroy New York City," and he also instituted deeply unpopular public service cuts to balance the city budget. Many of those cuts have since been rolled back amid stronger-than-anticipated revenues lower-than-anticipated spending on services associated with caring for migrants.

Boy, 15, faces charges in gun slay of man, 18, in Brooklyn

A teenager has died two weeks after being shot on a Brooklyn basketball court - and a 15-year-old boy has been charged in the case, cops said Wednesday.

McNally Zamor, 18, was shot in the head on the court at E. 81st St. and Flatlands Ave. near Intermediate School 68 Isaac Bildersee in Canarsie at about 5:40 p.m. Oct. 16, police said.

The victim was taken to Brookdale University Hospital, where he died Friday.

A day after the shooting, a 15-year-old boy was arrested and charged with attempted murder and criminal possession of a weapon. Charges are likely to be upgraded now that the victim has died.

No clear motive has been established for the shooting. But cops said they were investigating to see if there was a connection to an earlier shooting, which might be evidence of a larger gang war in the area

The shooting was followed by a spate of shootings involving five teens who were shot and killed on five consecutive days.


Clarence Jones, 16, Malachi Deberry, 15, Tae'Arion Mungo, 16, Tristan Sanders, 15, and Joshua Sparrow, 18, were all killed between Thursday and Monday in separate shootings on consecutive days in Harlem, Brooklyn and the Bronx.

The shootings added a new level of angst and outrage in communities already gripped by frustration and fear over out-of-control gun violence. There have been no arrests in those five slavs.



BEAU OF SLAIN ARTIST FOUND DEAD IN SUICIDE

Police say older lover who bankrolled Hamptons victim's projects killed her; mentor warned it would be dicey to 'use him & leave him'

Sabina Rosas, the Brooklyn artist found murdered in a highend Hamptons spa, was killed by a boyfriend who had been financially supporting her and has now been found dead of suicide.

Rosas, 33, was staying at the posh Shou Sugi Ban House in Water Mill with 56-year-old boyfriend Thomas Gannon, who was later seen leaving the spa alone, according to cops. He was found dead of a self-inflicted gunshot wound in his home in Honesdale, Pa., according to Suffolk County police.

Artist and lecturer Liz Phillips, a longtime mentor to Rosas, told the Daily News Wednesday that Gannon was an indulgent figure in the victim's life, having built a home for Rosas in her native Tajikistan, but the relationship was far from ideal.

"He was much older and he dedicated himself to facilitating whatever she wanted," Phillips said, adding that the couple had been dating for several years and that Gannon had unnerved her and her husband.

"We both had the creeps, to tell you the truth," said Phillips. "We both thought it was weird and not quite right, and I warned her, 'I think you can't use him and leave him.' Because she said, 'He's kind of boring but he's OK, he's helping me do all these things."

"I think she was [trying to leave him.] She expressed that she was getting bored at some point. Months ago," she added.

Phillips said she didn't know

how Rosas and Gannon met, but she had hosted the couple for dinner on two separate occasions and described their relationship as "nothing good."

"We thought it was sick the way he had dropped his life and was gonna follow her anywhere and everywhere," she said. "He went everywhere with her. Like, she'd go to a retreat thing, he'd be waiting for her in town."

Rosas had never complained of feeling in danger around Gannon, said Phillips, but the circumstances may have suddenly shifted, added the mentor.

"People are different when they're being left," she said. "I could see how he could go home and kill himself. But honestly to kill her?"

Rosas was making plans to visit Phillips at her Queens home on Monday and said she was not with Gannon, which led Phillips to believe Rosas had ended the relationship with the older man.

"Because he came everywhere with her. I had a sense that she wanted to get away from him," said Phillips.

The day the visit was to take place Rosas' body was found.

"I said to her, 'It'll be great to catch up.' On Monday she went silent. On Monday, [I asked her] 'What time are you coming?' No answer. 'What's going on?' No answer. I called and I texted."

Phillips was shocked by the murder and suicide but grateful Rosas' killing did not remain a mystery for long.

It's absolutely horrible, and it's a shame," she said.

"I'm glad they know who killed her. I wasn't surprised. And it's somewhat better to know who killed her, but it's horrible. I wish he just took his own life is all I can honestly say. Just let her be. I can't really fathom how he could do that."

Phillips met Rosas at SUNY's Purchase College when Rosas pursued a bachelor's degree at the Westchester County liberal arts school and was a teaching assistant for Phillips.

"I was her professor and she was my TA [teaching assistant], and she was my assistant on several projects. And I got her a residency. So we were close," said Phillips. "She was an individual artist and student and an energetic creative person. Fantastic."

Rosas was planning to travel to Portugal next month to attend her first art residency.

"We're just very sorry to lose a talented young artist," Phillips said. 'She was great at what she did, and she was getting better and she was DAILY NEWS NYDailyNews.com Thursday, October 31, 2024 5



making work and she was traveling all over the world, gathering together other women artists who were from Central Asia to make a book."

"But again," she added, "this was all facilitated by guys like Tom – the guy who killed her."

Rosas had raised \$1,520 for the Portugal trip on GoFundMe with a post she made two months ago, calling the funds she raised a birthday gift.

"This experience will allow me to create new work in a beautiful, inspiring environment," she wrote in the post, under her maiden name Sabina Khorramdel. "I'm about to birth something new and meaningful into the world."

Gannon contributed \$1,000 – two thirds of the money she collected – to the trip.

"You have an amazing gift and soon all the world will see," her killer wrote. "I love you."

Rosas promised hand-painted postcards documenting her journey to those who donated.

"As I approach my 33rd birthday, I can't help but chuckle at the fact that 33 is often associated with the age of Jesus when he made his ultimate sacrifice," she wrote. "While I'm not planning anything dramatic, I see this year as a turning point in my life."

A spa employee found Rosas dead in a guest room at about 12:30 p.m. Monday, Suffolk County police said.

Her death was violent, but Suffolk County police did not immediately disclose how she died. An autopsy will determine her cause of death.

Rosas' estranged husband, who splits his time between Brooklyn and Miami, flew back to New York Tuesday morning before going to Long Island to speak with police about the shocking slay, his Coney Island roommate told the The News on Tuesday.

"He's in shock. I think everyone is in shock," said the roommate, who gave her name as Victoria. Rosas had spent the past year in her native Tajikistan, the roommate said.

On Wednesday, Rosas' family put out a plea for anyone with information about the artist's death to come forward.

"Your support during this challenging time is a testament to just how special Sabina was and will remain," the family said in a statement. "As the eldest of three daughters, Sabina brought excitement, adventure, joy and love to our family. We are devastated by this senseless loss."

The father of Rosas' first husband was also left stunned by the

news. "I'm sorry to hear that," former father-in-law Roberto Rosas told The News on Tuesday. "She was a good girl."

Rosas was part of the 2021 Technology Immersion Program at Harvestworks, a nonprofit that assists artists creating work with technology. She received a scholarship from the organization that spring.

Rosas was forced to relocate to Turkmenistan at the age of 2 after civil war broke out in her home country, her bio on Harvestworks' site says. Due to "dictatorial conditions," she again fled, this time to Crimea, in 2000.

She made her way to the U.S. by herself when she was 17 to study art, obtaining an associate's degree at Borough of Manhattan Community College while living in Forest Hills, Queens, then made her way to Westchester


County to pursue a bachelor's degree in new media at Purchase College, according to the site.

Shou Sugi Ban House, located on Montauk Highway, is described as a "private sanctuary and gated compound surrounded by evergreen trees and lush grasses."

The Japanese-themed luxury spa and wellness resort was lauded as an outstanding destination by Conde Nast Traveler Online, Vogue magazine and Travel + Leisure, according to their websites.

Boasting saunas, steam rooms and both indoor and outdoor fireplaces on 5 acres of land as well a culinary program designed by a Michelin-starred chef, it has hosted celebrities such as Kate Hudson, Cynthia Rowley, and Stella McCartney.

An NYPD recruit graduating the Police Academy Thursday knew he wanted to be a police officer at age 9 – ever since he witnessed a cop save his sister's life and later become a guardian angel for his entire family.

On March 12, 1998, Xavier Duran was crossing 36th Ave. in Corona, Queens, with his mother, Ana, brother, Luiny, and sister, Jeannette, when a Mistic Iced Tea delivery truck plowed into them, crushing his sister's leg.

A second later, NYPD Sgt. Lino Minetto and his partner Police Officer Lisa Cordero arrived at the scene, grabbed Jeannette and put her in the back of their patrol car before an ambulance could arrive.

Minetto cradled Jeannette in his arms, keeping the tot awake by asking her how old she was and her favorite color as his partner raced them to Elmhurst Hospital Center – saving the child's life.

"I wanted to do what he did for my family," Duran said about Minetto, who Jeannette affectionally calls "uncle."

"I wanted to do that to another family – to make a change, make a difference," the 35-year-old rookie reflected about the now-retired sergeant's heroic save.

Minetto, who left the department in 2006, will be joining Duran's family at Madison Square Garden Thursday when Xavier graduates with 588 of his fellow recruits.

Thursday's graduating class will include 454 men and 154 women. Out of that number, 137 were born in another country,

NYPD officials said.

When he joined the NYPD, Duran was asked to write an essay – known as a "49" in cop speak – about why he wanted to become a cop. He didn't have to think twice, he said.

"He basically saved us," Duran said. "I said, I had to do the same for someone else, and I'm going to do it."

Minetto and Cordero were just three blocks away when the call came over about the 8:30 a.m. accident.

"I saw the gravity of the situation," Minetto said, "and decided to basically scoop her up, throw her in a plastic blanket we had and take her to the hospital because she was bleeding profusely."

The doctors at Elmhurst Hospital ultimately had to amputate Jeannette's leg, but the little girl lived and thrived despite all

the odds against her, Minetto said.

"My report was going to say [she] was likely to die," Minetto recalled. "That's what we expected. But [then] I saw over a dozen family members in the room next door all on their hands and knees all praying. Between the doctors and power of prayer and the incredible strength of this young lady, that's what saved her. I just got her there quick enough so that could happen."

Investigators later determined that the crash was caused by heavy sun glare temporarily blinding the driver as he made a turn at the intersection. The driver, who remained at the scene and called 911, was hit with several summonses, but never charged criminally.

As Jeannette recovered, Minetto, who also grew up in Corona, was quickly



adopted by Duran's family. A few months later, when he received \$250 from the New York State Police Surgeon's Life Saving Award in appreciation for his quick-thinking save, he used it to start a fundraising effort to raise money for Jeannette's medical care and schooling.

"Minetto is a hero, but not the kind easily satisfied," the Daily News wrote at the time. "He doesn't want praise as much as imitation. He has called on New Yorkers to open their wallets and match the money he has donated."

The humble Minetto remembers how good it felt watching complete strangers walk into the 105th Precinct stationhouse in Queens and "give us \$50 or whatever they could to the fund."

"I just did what anybody would do and what everyone should do," he said about

his fundraising efforts.

Over the years, Minetto would show up at the Duran home and see Jeannette, who was fitted with a prosthetic leg, continue to grow. She never let her handicap stop her as she swam, rollerbladed and rode her bike around the neighborhood.

"I came by to say hi one time and she was on roller skates," Minetto remembered. "The next time I saw her she was up in a tree."

Minetto, whose own daughter was about Jeannette's age at the time of the accident, felt an instant connection with the child he cradled in his arms during that breakneck race to the hospital.

"There was a juxtaposition with my daughter and [Jeannette] at the accident," he remembered. "I did feel I was looking at my daughter for a brief second."

Jeannette, now 32, remembers Minetto trying to keep her awake in the back of the squad car and being a presence during her recovery. Minetto attended her grade school graduation, sweet 16 party, high school graduation and her wedding, where husband Andy Payamps, 35, met the family hero for the first time.

"I was nervous the day of the wedding but more nervous to meet him because I wanted his approval," Payamps said. "Because of him, she's here."

Jeannette credits Minetto for saving her. Meanwhile, her close-knit family helped, as she put it, "make me feel like nothing has changed."

"My life has been normal. They've made it as normal as possible," she said of her parents and siblings. "They have made me feel like I had no limits. My mother always pushed me not to let anybody tell me that I couldn't do something."

When Xavier said he planned to attend the Police Academy, neither Jeannette nor the rest of her family were surprised at the news.

"He has always been the protector of the family," she said of her older brother. "He's always the one looking out for us. I remember us being very young and him saying he wanted to become a police officer"

Two weeks ago, Jeannette reached out to Minetto and asked him to attend her brother's graduation.

"He's in his 30s, I said, 'What graduation?'" he recalled. "They said, 'The Police Academy.' I said, 'What?'

"It was a good surprise," he said, smiling.



Struck by van as he directs traffic in Brooklyn; driver is arrested

A worker directing traffic at a Brooklyn construction site was hit and killed by a van driver who was then arrested for criminally negligent homicide, police said Wednesday.

The driver was behind the wheel of an Enterprise rental van zipping east on Myrtle Ave. in Bedford-Stuyvesant when he tried to get around a slow-moving box truck heading in the same direction about 2 p.m. on Tuesday, cops said.

As he tried to skirt around

the left side of the truck near Walworth St., the van went into oncoming traffic next to a construction zone, sideswiping the box truck, cops said.

The van then slammed into 37-year-old Luis Mario Sangurima, a construction flagger wearing a reflective yellow vest who was directing drivers down a narrow lane past the construction site, surveillance video of the crash seen by the Daily News shows.

Work crews had taken over a portion of the street as they worked on the property.

The van slammed into an

oncoming Honda Odyssey after plowing into Sangurima, cops said.

Medics rushed Sangurima to Woodhull Medical Center, but he couldn't be saved. He lived in Newark, according to cops.

Driver Clyde Mercury, 36, was arrested at the scene and charged with criminally negligent homicide, reckless endangerment, reckless driving and failure to exercise due care. He lives in Crown Heights, according to cons

Mercury's arraignment in Brooklyn Criminal Court was pending Wednesday.



Suspect flees to B'klyn apt. after man is fatally stabbed

A 42-year-old man was stabbed to death on a Brooklyn street early Wednesday by a killer who then barricaded himself in his nearby apartment, police said.

The victim was stabbed multiple times all over his body on Atlantic Ave. near Monaco Place in Ocean Hill just before 8 a.m.

The killer fled into an apartment building across the street, police said.

Medics rushed the victim to Brookdale University Hospital, but he could not be saved. His name was not immediately released.

Cops traced the stabber to his apartment, but he refused to come out.

After about two hours he finally surrendered and was taken to the hospital for an evaluation. Criminal charges against him were pending.

Newborn, umbilical cord still attached, found dead in Bx.

A newborn baby was found dead Wednesday morning in the courtyard of a Bronx building, police

Police and EMS responded around 11:15 a.m. to a 911 call at Gleason and St. Lawrence Aves. in Soundview, where behind an apartment building, they found the newborn infant unconscious and unresponsive.

The baby, whose umbilical cord

was still attached, was pronounced dead at the scene.

There have been no arrests as police are trying to track down the child's parents.

The medical examiner will determine the cause of death.

RFK Jr. sez Don promised health czar gig; campaign says hold on

Robert F. Kennedy Jr. has claimed former President Donald Trump has promised to give him control of several agencies overseeing health in a future administration, but a campaign spokesman demurred Wednesday and said nothing has been decided.

The anti-vaccine activist, who ended his independent presidential campaign and endorsed Trump in August, said in a newly unearthed video that Trump has vowed to give him oversight of the Health and Human Services and Agriculture departments.

"Trump has promised me ... control of the public health agencies ... which, you know, is key to making America healthy," Kennedy said in a video sent to his supporters.

"I stand ready to help him rid the public health agencies of their pervasive conflicts and corruption and restore their tradition of gold-standard, evidence-based science," Kennedy added in a statement.

RFK Jr. ticked off the National Institutes of Health, Centers for Disease Control and the Food and Drug Administration as organizations that he would oversee if Trump beats Vice President Kamala Harris in the hotly contested race for the White House.

Trump told his rally at Madison Square that he intended to let RFK Jr. "go wild on medicines" if he wins back power.

RFK Jr. has also been named to a slot on the Trump transition team, although it's not really clear how much power that would give him.

Trump campaign spokesman Steven Cheung said Wednesday that no promises have been made about cabinet positions or agency heads.

"Discussions of who will serve in a second Trump Administration is premature," Cheung said.

Kennedy, the son of slain presidential candidate Robert F. Kennedy, is perhaps the nation's most prominent vaccine skeptic.

He has spread outlandish conspiracy theories about the COVID-19 vaccines which most



public health experts credit with saving the lives of millions of people worldwide.

Kennedy, who has been ostracized by several members of his storied Democratic family, is a leader of the so-called "medical freedom movement," which broadly opposes vaccine mandates like the ones that require school children to be immunized.

Trump championed the COVID vaccines and once bragged that his Operation Warp Speed vaccine development program saved millions of lives. But he has changed his tune to

reflect the widespread anti-vaxxer sentiment among his right-wing MAGA supporters.
Public health experts say

Kennedy would be a disastrous choice to lead any federal agency but particularly ones that oversee life-saving vaccines.

Even Dr. Jerome Adams, Trump's former surgeon general, warned against giving RFK Jr. any significant public health role, especially one related to vaccines.

"I would advise Republicans [against going] backward on one of the No. 1 public health achievements made in the last 50 to 75 years in this country," Adams said Monday at a conference of the American Public Health Association.

'GARBAGE' IN, GARBAGE OUT

Kam backs away from Joe's slam on Trump fans as Don hits back

Kamala Harris sought Wednesday to distance herself from President Biden's controversial remarks that Republicans claim labeled their supporters as "garbage" as former President Donald Trump sought to make political hay from the dispute.

'I strongly disagree with any criticism of people based on who they vote for," said Harris, adding that she hasn't talked to Biden about the controversy. "I will be a president for all Americans whether you vote for me or not."

Trump hit back hard at his Democratic rival as they battle for support with less than a week to go before Election Day on

Joe Biden finally said what he and Kamala really think about our supporters. He called them garbage." Trump told a rally in Rocky Mount, N.C. "My response is very simple: You can't lead America if you don't that was amended to add the apostrolove Americans."

Vice presidential nominee Tim Walz echoed Biden's own clarification that the "garbage" remark was a reference only to the comedian who called Puerto Rico a "floating island of garbage" at former Trump's stormy Madison Square Garden rally over the weekend.

"President Biden was very clear that he's speaking about the rhetoric we heard," Walz said.

Walz added that Harris is the nominee who "makes the message," effectively distancing the ticket from Biden a bit in the closing week of the campaign.

Biden made the controversial "garbage" remark during a Zoom call with Latino leaders Tuesday.

He said: "The only garbage I see floating out there is his supporter's ... his ... his demonization of Latinos is unconscionable," according to a White House transcript phe in "supporter's" after it initially read 'supporters."

Republicans quickly pounced on the comments, arguing Biden was referring to Trump supporters, plural, as "garbage."

They compared the remarks with Hillary Clinton's infamous 2016 attack on MAGA loyalists as a "basket of deplorables," a comment many credited with solidifying support for Trump ahead of his victory in that election.

Biden quickly clarified that he was referring only to comedian Tony Hinchcliffe, who made the hateful jokes at the MSG rally, not Trump supporters as a whole.

"That's all I meant to say," Biden tweeted. Democrats were hoping to quickly put the controversy over Biden's remarks behind them, especially since they want to keep Trump on the political hot seat for his refusal to apologize for the insults at his rally, which targeted Puerto Ricans as well

as other Latinos and Blacks.

With early voting in full swing and Election Day looming, the remarks could swing Latino voters against Trump in some of the seven battleground states, especially Pennsylvania, the single most pivotal swing state.

A 4% share of the Keystone State's voters are Latino, and about half of those are of Puerto Rican descent, a potent voting bloc.


Reggaeton star Nicky Jam on Wednesday withdrew his endorsement for Trump over the ugly attack on Puerto Rico.

"Never in my life did I think that a month later, there would come a comedian to criticize my country," the performer said in Spanish on his social media account.

Trump, who hopes to improve his support among Latinos, failed to apologize or even mention the controversy in a speech in the Latino-heavy city of Allentown, Pa.

He appeared to shrug off the outrage felt by many Puerto Ricans when he told Fox News, "I can't imagine it's a big deal."

Would you shut up, Man?

Judge puts Rudy on mute in hearing over rant vs. sex assault accuser

A judge was forced to put a ranting Rudy Giuliani on mute during a virtual hearing Wednesday in his Manhattan sexual assault and harassment case after he launched into personal attacks against his accuser, Noelle Dunphy.

More than an hour into the hearing, the embattled former mayor and Donald Trump lawyer lobbed a series of unfounded allegations against Dunphy, calling her character into question.

"Your Honor, this is outrageous," Dunphy's lawyer Justin Kelton said.

Manhattan Supreme Court Justice Nicholas Moyne yelled at Giuliani multiple times, asking him to stop talking. Finally, he put him on mute.

"Mr. Giuliani, you're going to cause yourself harm by doing this, OK? So I'm going to protect you from yourself at this time," Moyne said.

"These are not legal arguments that you're making right now," he said. "These are personal attacks, and this is not the time for that, OK? I'm not going to allow it, I'm sorry. I tried to treat you with respect and with deference, but you have to follow my rules."

Giuliani, representing himself in the case, proceeded to shout at the camera after being muted before sitting back in his

alleging he subjected her to sexual misconduct throughout her time working for him as a business consultant from January 2019 through the end of 2021.

Her suit accuses the 80-year-old Giuliani, in graphic detail, of forcing her to engage in "violent sex," attend video calls naked, and work in short shorts he bought printed with an American flag.

She has also accused Giuliani of requiring her to work off the books until his divorce with Judith Giuliani was final and then refusing to pay her some \$2 million in wages.

The suit, which demands at least \$10 million and a jury trial, lists claims including sexual harassment, sexual assault, breach of contract and retaliatory discharge. It accuses Giuliani of creating a hostile work environment and violating the city's Gender-Motivated Violence Protection Act.

Giuliani vehemently denies the allegations and says that Dunphy was never his employee.

Wednesday's hearing came a week after Giuliani was ordered in a separate case to turn over control of almost everything he owns of value - including his Upper East Side apartment – within seven days to the Georgia mother and daughter he was found liable for baselessly accusing of ballot fraud and ordered to pay around

Dunphy's suit was frozen, along with Dunphy sued Giuliani in May 2023, many against Giuliani, when he filed for

bankruptcy after a jury awarded the election workers, Ruby Freeman and Wandrea "Shaye" Moss, the staggering sum in December. It's back on track after a judge threw out the bankruptcy matter, partly because Giuliani was being murky about his finances.

On Wednesday, Moyne told Adam Katz, a lawyer representing Giuliani's business entities, that it was time to respond to the accusations.

Once known as "America's Mayor," Giuliani is also facing charges in Arizona and Georgia for his alleged efforts to meddle in the last presidential election, to which he's pleaded not guilty.

Wearing a black suit and a blue-andyellow striped tie, Giuliani, who frequently forgot to take himself off mute, appeared to be eating breakfast during the hearing. At one point, he piped up to successfully protest his convicted former business associate Lev Parnas trying to dial in.

Ruling on the motions, the judge agreed to strike some particularly salacious details from the suit as scandalous and unnecessarily pleaded.

The judge agreed to exclude allegations

Giuliani that had extramarital affairs and a photo depicting an infamous scene in "Borat Subsequent Moviefilm," in which Giuliani was captured with his hands down his pants in a hotel room with a young woman.

Kelton argued that it was "the best thing we have to show what happened" during an alleged assault at Giuliani's Upper East Side apartment, where Dunphy alleges he forced her to perform oral sex. Moyne said a jury could hear the allegations without seeing the image from the film.

Moyne denied a request from Katz to exclude details about Giuliani's alleged drinking habits, finding they went to the heart of her allegations.

The suit describes him as being a chronic, "functioning" alcoholic who went on "alcohol-drenched rants that included sexist, racist and antisemitic remarks," many of which Dunphy says she recorded.

Moyne also agreed to strike allegations of sexualized and demeaning comments Dunphy says he made about Hilary Clinton, former House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-Calif.) and British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher.

Dunphy's lawyer argued they established a pattern of Giuliani's hostility toward women. The judge said the comments could stay, but not the names.

Katz contended Dunphy included the comments "made in jest" to taint the jury pool "and embarrass the former mayor."

"And it worked," Katz said.

COPS: WOMAN CHOKED IN MIDTOWN IS LEFT IN CRITICAL CONDIT

A woman in her 30s appears to have been choked either at or possibly near a Midtown hotel early Wednesday, police said.

Officers responding to a 1:16 a.m. call from Mount Sinai Hospital were told that an unidentified, unconscious woman of that age had been rushed there in critical condition by medics and that, based on her injuries, she appeared to have been choked.

Police then went to where the woman had been picked up by medics - the Hotel Riu Plaza New York Times Square – and found video that allegedly shows a man dragging the woman in front of the hotel.

"It was a couple. They were together, they were fighting earlier," a worker at the hotel

The relationship between the two was not immediately clear, nor was it immediately known if the woman had been staying at or visiting the hotel.

"There is video, she was unconscious, and he was dragging her out front," the hotel worker said. "The bosses aren't saying anything about it."

As of midafternoon, she was reportedly still listed in critical condition.

The woman did not have ID on her, and it's not clear if her identity is known yet.

The suspect is described as Black and was seen in the video wearing a tan coat, black pants, a black knitted hat and white sneakers. He was also carrying a black shoulder bag.

Police ask that anyone with information about this incident call Crime Stoppers at (800) 577-TIPS. All calls are confidential.

Cop in hospital after driver plows into him during B'klyn traffic stop

A police officer attempting to stop a man driving a car without a license plate in Brooklyn was hurt when the man plowed into the officer, cops said.

Around 9:30 p.m. police officers spotted the vehicle and attempted to pull it over near Forbell St. and Sutter Ave., but instead of stopping, the 25-year-old driver accelerated into one of the officers, injuring his leg, police said.

The driver, Winston Timberlake, was arrested following the incident. The Brooklyn resident faces charges of assault, reckless endangerment, reckless driving, aggravated unlicensed operation, speed violation and fleeing from an officer in a motor vehicle.

The officer was transported to an area hospital in stable condition.

According to a police source, one of the officers involved fired his gun and did not hit anything, but the NYPD would not immediately confirm that detail.

Newark's Star-Ledger, other N.J. newspapers to end print edition

Newark's Star-Ledger will publish its final newspaper on

Newark Morning Ledger Co., which owns The Star-Ledger, cited rising costs, decreasing circulation and reduced demand for print as reasons it's shutting down its Montville, N.J., production plant and going digital, according to the paper's website, NJ.com.

The Jersey Journal will also end 157 years of printing newspapers at the start of February as a result of Newark Morning Ledger Co. closing its production facility.

NJ.com also reports its parent company, Advance Local — which owns NJ Advance Media too — will stop printing The Times of Trenton and the South Jersey Times on Feb. 2.

"Today's announcement represents the next step into the digital future of journalism in New Jersey," NJ Advance Media



President Steve Alessi said in a statement reported by NJ.com.

Alessi called going digital a "forward-looking decision" that will allow the company to allocate resources to the journalism produced by its newsroom rather

than a print product.

He said his company's newsroom employs more reporters than it did a year ago and expects to get even bigger next year.

NJ Advance Media journalists will continue contributing

material for NJ.com and digital versions of The Star-Ledger, The Times of Trenton and the South Jersey Times. Star-Ledger employees cut loose will reportedly receive severance and transition assistance.

NJ.com claims its online traffic -15.2 million unique visits in the most recent month for which data were available - make it the nation's largest local news site. By contrast, The Star-Ledger's print circulation has reportedly dropped more than 20% in the past year.

The Star-Ledger is New Jersey's largest newspaper.

According to NJ.com, Newark's first newspaper was the Daily Eagle, which hit newsstands in 1832. That paper became the Newark Star-Ledger in 1939 when it merged with The Newark Star-Eagle. "Newark" was formally dropped from the title more than 30 years later.

The Star-Ledger's era-ending news spread quickly on social media, where the future of physical newspapers stoked debate.

"Same old story: 'Rising costs, decreasing circulation and reduced demand for print,'" CNN media reporter Brian Stelter posted on X.

An upstate woman intentionally jumped into Niagara Falls with her two young children, including a 5-monthold baby, state police said Wednesday.

The incident occurred around 9 p.m. on Monday when officials with the State Park Police and State Police Bureau of Criminal Investigation were called to an area near Goat Island, between Bridal Veil Falls and Horseshoe Falls.

An investigation determined that 33-year-old Chaianti Means, 9-year-old Roman Rossman and 5-month-old Mecca Means, all of upstate Niagara Falls - had gone over a safety guardrail and "went over Niagara Falls on Luna Island," located just off the north side of Goat Island.

James Trooper State

O'Callaghan confirmed Wednesday the woman was the mother of the two kids. He said the family of the victims was being very cooperative with investigators.

While the circumstances surrounding the suspected jump remain under investigation, authorities said they believe it was "intentional in nature."

Search-and-rescue teams - including park police, unmanned aircraft and marine patrol, and New York State Police aviation and underwater recovery units - had been working to locate the three victims since the night of the incident, law enforcement said. Recovery efforts had been unsuccessful as of Wednesday evening.

The Niagara Falls Police Department and Niagara Charter Schools are also assisting in the investigation, officials said. The incident doesn't pose a safety threat to the public.

Brooklyn high school teacher is accused of choking a 15-yr.-old student who was late for class

A public high school math teacher has been arrested for choking a 15-year-old student who showed up late for class, police said Wednesday.

The victim was treated at Maimonides Midwood Community Hospital for bruises on his neck.

The teacher, Gary Zeng, 27, was charged Tuesday with strangulation, criminal obstruction of breathing and endangering the welfare of a child, police said.

The incident happened Tuesday afternoon at the High School of Sports Management on

Benson Ave. in Bath Beach.

The student told police that he and other students showed up late and entered the classroom, despite Zeng telling them to stay out, police said.

Zeng admitted he "lost his cool and shouldn't have done it," police said.

Jenna Lyle, a spokeswoman for the Education Department, said the "alleged behavior is completely unacceptable, and nothing is more important than the safety and well-being of our students."

Zeng, she said, "has been reassigned away from students pending the outcome of the arrest, and if convicted, we will pursue termination." **With Cayla Bamberger**

54-year-old man is fatally stabbed on a Coney Island subway platform

A 54-year-old man was fatally stabbed on the platform of a Coney Island subway station, police said Wednesday.

The victim was stabbed in the back at the Stillwell Ave. station, the terminus for several Brooklyn subway lines, about 11:20 p.m. on Tuesday, cops said.

He stumbled bleeding from the platform on to an idling N train, where cops found him sitting in a corner seat unconscious.

He was rushed by medics to NYU Langone Hospital-Brooklyn, where he died

at 12:06 a.m. on Wednesday, police said. His name was not immediately released, but cops say he lived in the Bronx.

The killer, a man believed to be in his 30s clad in a green shirt, got away and is being sought. He was last seen on Stillwell Ave. police said. The murder weapon was not recovered.

The murder is the ninth this year in the city's transit system, nearly double the five slayings in all of 2023. Ten people were murdered in the subway system in 2022.

Through Sunday, the overall serious crime rate in transit is down 6%, led by a 16% drop in robberies and a 5% decrease in felony assaults.

A top deputy of the school system cautioned against comparing Summer Rising to a more typical term.

We intentionally make it flexible for families to be in and out, to not mandate a certain thing, to allow them to opt out a couple weeks," said Emma Vadehra, deputy chancellor of operations and finance.

"We do talk long and hard about how to change this program every year, for whatever it's worth, and continue to try and improve. That is not something we've been looking to change, because we think that flexibility in a free program is actually appropriate," she added.

About 81% of parents who applied on time to Summer Rising received an offer for their child, an increase from 68% the year before, Vadehra said. A majority of those families received their first choice program.

Summer Rising also uses a waitlist. If a student does not attend by the first day of the second week, and their parents cannot be reached despite multiple attempts, then students are removed and their seats offered to the family next in line.

Councilwoman Althea Stevens (D-Bronx), who chairs the youth committee, questioned whether the city is changing its roster too late in the summer, when families already needed to find alternatives for child care.

'We are trying to figure this out by the second week," said Stevens. "We're going to be calling parents who probably already found other accommodations.'



Extra day off, all thanks to an 8th-grader

A Brooklyn eighth-grader has convinced Mayor Adams and the city's public school system to cancel classes on the Monday before winter break, officials announced Wednesday.

Because Christmas Eve falls on a Tuesday this year, students were scheduled to attend school on Dec. 23 before a weeklong recess.

But Isaac Regnier, who attends Intermediate School 96 Seth Low in Bensonhurst, launched a petition to fix the school calendar, saying few of his classmates will show up for school that day. By the time of the announcement, his appeal that he crafted with his dad and sister had gathered about 23,000 signatures.

'I feel so proud of myself for all that hard work I did," said Isaac, 13, at a press conference at United Federation of Teachers headquarters.

A child prodigy in calendars and numbers, Isaac not only recognized the flaw in the school calendar, but can guess the day of the week of a birthday if given the date and the year. After the event, he determined UFT President Michael Mulgrew's: it was a Thursday.

"These young people are bubbling with ideas because they view life at a different set of lens than we do," said Adams, "and if we're not willing to listen to them, we're going to miss many opportunities."

The city has increasingly felt pressure on its school calendar. State law requires school must be in session for 180 days, but with the addition of new holidays in recent years - including Diwali this Friday - education officials have less flexibility during the school

The administration and union officials insisted they will not have to add an extra day onto the school year to take Dec. 23 off, using noninstructional days to count toward the statutory requirement.

As for Isaac (photo), he plans on making the most of his extra time off from school.

"Maybe we'll travel," he said. "I'm planning on having our friends over for New Year's, if possible. And yeah, we're gonna stay up past midnight on New Year's. Jan. 1 is a Wednesday next year."

IT'S BANH MI OH MY!

Henry's in B'klyn an ideal spot to get perfect Vietnamese sandwich

I have always been the firm believer that the Vietnamese banh mi is the perfect sandwich. There's often at least two types of meat (though I've never met a tofu banh mi I didn't like), tangy pickled vegetables, fresh herbs, a spice level that isn't intolerable, and crunchy daikon and cucumber, all served on crusty French bread. In New York, Henry's in Brooklyn is the deli to get a banh mi.

Henry's is tiny — so tiny that I passed not once, but twice, when in search of my beloved banh mi in Park Slope. Upon entering, with just three tiny barstools on the left side of the small storefront, most folks were popping in and out to get takeout orders that came out impressively fast.

The menu has a good selection of banh mis, from classic pork to shredded chicken. There's also vegetarian pork, vegetarian chicken and tofu, and even a sardine banh mi. I'm a purist in this sense, and banh mis need no messing with, so I knew I'd be going for the classic.

Henry's also offers milk teas and flavored

teas, and, of course, Vietnamese iced coffee. Aside from drinks and sandwiches, there's a small selection of appetizers, salads, rice bowls and pho. For such a tiny place, they have an impressively decent variety of dishes.

I ordered my classic banh mi and threw in a green shredded papaya salad for some extra veg. They asked me which spice level I'd like on my sandwich, and though I usually push it to the max, I said medium, after learning many times that Southeast Asia does not mess around when it comes to heat.

After around 10 minutes of waiting, my name was called. The banh mi at Henry's, which ran me \$10.25 (the cost for all sandwiches regardless of toppings), was about the length of my forearm. It's on a typical baguette-style bread, which is largely attributed to the French colonization of Vietnam in the 1800s. My sandwich was completely stuffed with meat and vegetables – so much so that, when I unwrapped the parchment paper, nibbles of roasted ground pork began to pour out.

Aside from crusty bread and roasted

pork, the classic at Henry's also has pâté, cucumber, cilantro, julienned carrots, daikon radish, Vietnamese ham and, in a further nod to the French, mayo and butter.

On the side was a thin, translucent vinegar-based sauce and packets of hot sauce though, because I asked for medium spice, there was already a great kick to the sandwich.

The banh mi at Henry's hit all of the marks. The carrots were supersweet and tangy, the spice level was just enough to get my sinuses going without overpowering the other flavors, the roasted ground pork had a nice nuttiness, the daikon and herbs provided a crunchy, refreshing balance and the Vietnamese ham was just thick enough to hold it altogether. And I'm never mad at a baguette, so long as it's crusty on the outside and soft on the inside.

I had plans to check out some other restaurants in the neighborhood afterward, but I ended up scarfing the entire sandwich because I simply couldn't put it down. In between, I took bites of the green shredded papaya salad, which was a massive portion for only \$7.50. The papaya salad at Henry's

is easily enough to share with at least one or two friends. It's superclean, simple, bright and acidic, with a good texture from the crushed peanuts throughout.

My time at Henry's had me wondering why I don't seek out more banh mi in New York, and further proves my theory that the Vietnamese staple is indeed a perfect sandwich. Don't believe me? Go try a classic at Henry's for yourself.

America's strong economy

e are very pleased to say the American economy is doing quite well. In the third quarter of 2024, the nation's GDP – that's the value of all the goods and services it produces minus the value of the goods and services used in production – grew by 2.8%, a very healthy rate, so says the Bureau of Economic Analysis, a unit of the U.S. Commerce Department that serves as "an independent, principal federal statistical agency that promotes a better understanding of the U.S. economy by providing timely, relevant, and accurate economic accounts data in an objective and cost-effective manner."

These are excellent findings, including that inflation is low, and should make all Americans happy. However, the professionals who produce these numbers are not rooting for the incumbent Democrats to keep control of the Senate or that the ruling Republicans maintain their House majority and they are not trying to help Kamala Harris and Democrats hold the White House over Donald Trump and the GOP.

But the "in" crowd holding public office does benefit in elections when the economic tide is rising, just they are punished when times are bad.

Tomorrow morning at 8:30, another set of nonpartisan career civil servants, at the Bureau of Labor Statistics (an agency of the U.S. Department of Labor) will publish the national employment stats for the month of October.

We used to joke when asked who would win a presidential election, to first tell us the unemployment rate first; low employment helps incumbents and a high jobless rate causes people to lose elections. We will find out next week how that old model holds up.

As for side-by-side comparing on GDP, annualized growth was at or below 2.8% for 10 out of the 16 quarters Trump was president. That included the sluggish

fourth quarter of 2018, which saw just 0.7% growth, and the slower-going fourth quarter of 2019 – before COVID hit – which registered just 1.8% growth. It also included the terrible pandemic in Q1 and Q2 of 2020, when the economy contracted by 4.6% and 29.9%, respectively.

ut another way, besides two Trump quarters in which the economy tanked, two quarters in which the economy grew by more than 4% – and one gangbusters quarter in which the country emerged from illness – economic growth in the 2017-2020 the Trump-Pence years generally kicked around 2-3%. That's right around the same output Joe Biden and Harris have delivered. As they say, six of one, half a dozen of the other

There are many other ways to measure an economy. Inflation painfully got the better of many paychecks from early in the Biden-Harris years through 2023 and Harris herself says that the price of groceries are too high. But at the same time, those years have seen better stock-market performance; more robust job growth; better wage growth; and lower unemployment. Who you side with on the economy may be more a matter of who you like.

Still, no economic indicators are pure products of presidential leadership. It's the Federal Reserve that taps or slams the gas or the brakes through monetary policy, feeding or containing growth and inflation. Fed Chair Jay Powell has been at the helm for seven years, serving during both the Trump and Biden administrations. Powell and his colleagues have successfully brought down inflation while preventing a recession. But they aren't on the ballot, Trump and Harris are.

When Americans go to the polls up until Tuesday, they will render their verdict.

Putin's Korean ringers

ome 10,000 North Korean troops, including special forces soldiers from a unit known as the Storm Corps, will likely be reaching the frontlines in Ukraine this week after being sent for training and acclimatization in Russia, the product of cozy relations between Russian dictator Vladimir Putin and his North Korean counterpart Kim Jong Un.

There are a number of significant concerns around this deployment, among them that it is about as concrete a marker as you can have of the nasty connections that Putin has worked to build and maintain. The Russian despot has long believed that the straightest path to counter U.S. and western global strength is through his own alliances of shared ideology and convenience and the imperialist expansion of his territory – the same mix of desires and efforts that has led to both world wars, among other things.

This might not be a numerically immense deployment, but it is a significant one at a time when Ukraine, which has variously gained and lost momentum throughout the war, currently seems to be on the back foot in some border regions. The North Korean soldiers are expected to bolster beleaguered and often poorly trained Russian forces in the disputed region of Kursk, where they have the potential to affect the tide of the conflict.

This impact also goes beyond just the mechanics on the ground. It's precedent; where will North Korea deploy its troops next? Will we see side by side with the Iranians in the Mideast? Or will there be Iranian troops in Russia next?

These renegade countries might retort, correctly, that an organization like NATO is itself an alliance

of troops, with a mandate towards collective security and defense. Yet NATO didn't invade Ukraine, Russia did.

For all of Putin's belligerent talk of an encroaching power at his gates, it's he who launched his ill-fated invasion now nearly three years ago. It's this decision that has cost hundreds of thousands of lives, including of his own people, destroyed swaths of Ukraine, wrecked his own military's readiness — which, obviously, is entirely counterproductive to his supposed aim of national security — and gotten his own country invaded in self-defense by Ukrainian forces.

n doing this, Putin has proved that such an alliance is not to be trusted and cannot be permitted, as it has at its core the aim of expansion, invasion and international belligerence. In any case, there are already concerns around Russia's adherence to the laws of war in how it's fought this invasion so far and how this deployment itself is being conducted. There are reports that the North Korean troops are donning Russian military uniforms during this operation, which is a violation in part because it muddies accountability.

Russia already stands credibly accused of engaging in widespread war crimes, including the torture and execution of Ukrainian prisoners and deportation of Ukrainian children. If North Koreans posing as Russian troops engage in further such crimes, who will be held responsible? Who do humanitarian personnel and journalists communicate with to coordinate safe passage? Who gives the ultimate orders? This is a desperate and dangerous game that Putin is playing, and the world as a whole is more dangerous for it.

Slurring Puerto Rico slurs all Americans

his week former President Donald Trump had a rally at Madison Square Garden with a string of speakers spewing offensive and bigoted rhetoric. One speaker taunted the crowd "I hear there is an island of garbage floating in the ocean ... It's called Puerto Rico". And none of the speakers that followed disassociated themselves from the comment.

It was obviously a repugnant comment to Puerto Ricans, but it was emblematic of Trump's "divide and conquer," hyper nationalist rhetoric that represents the essence of his campaign. It is also a great vignette of the ignorance of their attack. They represent "Americans" against the "invaders." Puerto Ricans are Americans! There are approximately 6 million Puerto Ricans across this nation and there are more Puerto Ricans in New York than anywhere besides Puerto Rico itself. They are an integral part of the American community and their contribution to the American experience is broad and deep.

Puerto Ricans have been by our side literally since this nation's founding in 1776. Gen. Bernardo de Galvez was governor of Louisiana, and led Puerto Ricans in battle against the British in the deep South. Puerto Ricans fought in the Civil War and the Spanish-American War. In every aspect of society, from sports, arts, government, science and medicine, Puerto Ricans have made invaluable contributions even prior to their becoming American citizens in 1917.

As a New Yorker I have grown-up with Puerto Ricans as neighbors, friends, colleagues, and family members and have deep affection and respect for the community. Puerto Rico, as an island in the northeastern Caribbean, has been under near constant assault by Mother Nature. Tropical storms and hurricanes, many say are increasing due to climate change, have posed great challenges.

For decades I have personally experienced the resilience, strength, endurance, and generosity of the Puerto Rican people during the worst of times. When I was in the federal government as Housing and Urban Development secretary in the 1990s and was on the ground for many of the devastating natural disasters. As governor of New York, we brought unprecedented assistance to Puerto Rico. We mobilized hundreds of New Yorkers to assist with rebuilding and vital donations of resources and supplies in numbers more

generous than I could have expected.

In many ways, New York has responded to fill the void left by the federal government. In truth, the despicable comment made in Madison Square Garden was especially hurtful because this country has treated Puerto Rico with disrespect and disregard in many ways for many years. It brought back the demeaning picture of Trump throwing paper towels to desperate Puerto Ricans in 2017 after the devastation of Hurricane Maria.

Puerto Rico, as an unincorporated territory of the United States, is a commonwealth - not a state - and therefore has no voting rights in Congress and does not vote in the presidential elections. Even though Puerto Rico is home to some of the Americans with the greatest needs, it has never received the assistance and attention it deserves. Federal assistance such as tax incentives, access to health care, economic development efforts, and storm recovery have been sporadic, fragmented, and unreliable. Basic systems are still inferior. Puerto Rico still struggles because it does not have a reliably functioning power system in place.

In the closing days of a political campaign one sees the essence of a candidate's appeal. The 25 speakers in Madison Square Garden sequentially and systematically insulted Jews, LGBTQ, Muslims, Blacks, Latinos, anyone who they could classify as "different" from "real Americans." The fundamental error in this racist, bigoted, nationalist screed is that there are no "real Americans" (unless you include indigenous people, which Trump clearly does not). We are all from somewhere else.

There is nothing new or novel about Trump's approach: to highlight and demonize the differences among us as a source of spreading fear and anger. It's political cancer: a virus purposely injected into the American body politic to separate one cell from another. It can lead to the death of a nation. It is an old lesson and we have seen it throughout history across the globe.

We must remember we are the "United" States of America and follow the better angels of our nature.

It was in a hospital conference room and the friend we were celebrating was unconscious upsairs, unaware of the significance of the

It doesn't have to be like this. There are proven solutions before the city and state that could save lives.

The city must comply with the legally mandated NYC Streets Plan to build 50

miles of protected bike lanes annually (which this administration is woefully behind on), follow through with Mayor Adams' commitment to make 1,000 intersections safer, comply with a state law that bans parking at the edges of intersections, and thoroughly implement Sammy's Law – a bill Jacob worked on – by lowering the city's speed limits in key areas.

Researchers have found that the crash rate decreases by 4 to 6% for every one mph reduction in speed, and the fatal crash rate decreases by 17%. Thirty percent of pedestrians struck by vehicles at an impact speed of 25 mph will sustain serious injury, and about 12% will die. In New York City's Neighborhood Slow Zones, which lowered the speed limit to 20 mph in concentrated areas, there was a 14% reduction in injurious crashes and a 31% reduction in injuries for both drivers and passengers.

Gov. Hochul must follow the law and unpause congestion pricing. When London implemented its congestion pricing program, fatal crashes fell by 27%.

Albany legislators can and must pass statewide laws to make our streets safer.

The Complete Streets Maintenance Bill would enable street safety features on road projects funded by the state or federal funding and another bill would slow down reckless drivers by installing intelligent speed assistance technology (ISA) in the vehicles of the worst repeat offenders, a tool that has been found to lead to a 37% decrease in fatal collisions.

It is not complicated, and the cost of the status-quo is too high. It's a horrible thing to have a loved one in this in-between.

Jacob is still with us and we are immensely grateful that we get to celebrate another birthday. We're lucky that he is being provided with wonderful medical care so that we can hold onto hope for a full recovery. That we can talk to him, and believe that he is hearing us. But Jacob is also gone from our lives as we knew him. We're grieving the person we lived and laughed with every day, the cheerleader who enthusiastically supported our endeavors, the confidante who intently listened and imparted such great advice (even if he wouldn't always follow it himself). We're missing our friend.

We miss Jacob when we walk past our go-to spots for bagels or coffee catch-ups, after-work drinks, or dinner dates.

We miss Jacob when something dramatic or hilarious happens in New York politics, as it frequently does.

We miss seeing the glint in his eye and his lips purse the way they do, right before he's about to propose an absolutely outlandish idea.

We miss making plans with him and dreaming big with him.

We miss Jacob every day, for a million reasons big and small.

We're missing our friend – but we know we're not alone. Nearly one in three New Yorkers have been injured in traffic violence. For every person killed in a traffic crash in New York City, another 11 are severely injured leaving too many families and friends in the same boat as us. That must change.

Mayor Adams, follow through on the city's infrastructure commitments and mandates. Governor, turn on congestion pricing. And Albany, support the state in making our streets safer.

Every day these laws aren't passed or implemented, family and friends go through what all of us who love Jacob have endured this past year. Every day these laws aren't passed or implemented, the city and state put New Yorkers at risk.

Judge to 'Jane Doe' accusing Diddy of rape -Reveal your name or lawsuit will be dismissed

A woman anonymously suing Sean "Diddy" Combs for an alleged rape in 2004 must reveal her identity or her case will be dismissed, a Manhattan federal judge ruled Wednesday.

The woman filed her lawsuit under the pseudonym Jane Doe, but Judge Mary Kay Vyskocil ruled that despite the sensitivity of the allegations, the alleged victim had not demonstrated that she's entitled to remain anonymous.

"Plaintiff has an interest in keeping her identity private given the sensitive nature of her allegations [and] the potential for public scrutiny of her personal life;" Vyskocil wrote in court documents obtained by the Daily News. "But Plaintiff, who is an adult, has now decided to file a lawsuit in which she accuses a famous person of engaging in heinous conduct approximately 20 years ago."

Among the multiple factors that weighed into the decision, Vyskocil ruled that Jane Doe offered insubstantial support for her claims that revealing her identity would pose "a risk of retaliatory physical or mental harm," especially given that Combs is currently behind bars awaiting trial in his federal sex trafficking case.

Jane Doe says she was a college freshman when Diddy enticed her and a friend to a photo shoot across the street from her college campus in Brooklyn in 2004, then invited them to an after-party at a Marriott hotel. The pair were then allegedly dragged into a separate room rather than being allowed to mingle with guests, with the man who put them there saying, "You know what you are here for."

Diddy then appeared and allegedly tried to make them do cocaine, according to TMZ. When they refused, Jane Doe claims, he forced her friend to perform oral sex on him under threat of death and would not let them leave the room.

After her friend complied, Jane Doe claims, Diddy turned his attention toward her, forcing her to undress and sexually assaulting her under additional threats. When someone she believes heard her cries and opened the door, her friend managed to flee. A security guard later came in and allowed her to leave the room, the woman alleges.

Jane Doe is demanding a jury trial, which will not happen unless she files a complaint in her own name, Vyskocil ruled. She was given until Nov. 13 to go public or the case will be thrown out.

The woman's lawsuit is one of 120 suits Texas attorney Tony Buzbee is filing against the rap mogul.

This is the second of Combs' accusers who has been told to reveal her identity. In February, Manhattan Federal Judge Jessica G. L. Clarke said another Jane Doe accuser must add her name to her complaint or risk having the case dismissed.

Combs is set to go on trial May 5 on charges of racketeering conspiracy, sex trafficking and transportation to engage in prostitution. He's being held at Brooklyn's Metropolitan Detention Center and could face more charges in the meantime.

The assailant took off, and there were no immediate arrests, police said. It was unclear what sparked the clash.

The victim was taken to Bellevue Hospital and was in stable condition, cops said.



Boone says he hasn't discussed future with Yankees

Bombers better in 2024, but far from the best

When the Yankees' 2023 season ended in Kansas City, Aaron Judge and teammates stared out at Kauffman Stadium's field. By not making the playoffs, they knew they had failed in epic fashion. And so they lingered, delaying the start of an early offseason for a few dejected moments.

"I think that's what fueled a lot of guys to go out there and say, 'Hey, I don't want to have this feeling again," Judge said after the Yankees won this year's ALDS in Kansas City.

The Yankee captain said that amid a champagne celebration. An additional party followed after the team beat down on another inferior AL Central opponent, the Guardians, in the ALCS.

The good times ended with the World Series, though, as the Yankees turned out to be the second-class club.

Facing a formidable Dodgers team, the Yankees lost the Fall Classic in just five games on Wednesday. Capitalizing on the Bombers' nightmarish defensive fifth inning, Los Angeles overcame a 5-0 deficit, ultimately won 7-6, and celebrated its second championship since 2020.

As the Dodgers' own party moved to the visitor's clubhouse in the Bronx, that undesirable, familiar feeling returned to the Yankees. Yet again, they failed to achieve their annual mission of winning a championship.

Yes, the Yankees came much closer to that goal than they did in 2023 and all the years between now and their last title in 2009. But this group often appeared less than championship caliber – few teams looked the part this year – especially after May.

Sloppy defense, bad baserunning and untimely hitting burdened the Yankees throughout an up-and-down regular season, even as they won the American League East and a pennant. Those same problems reared their ugly heads this October

On Wednesday, Judge, Anthony Volpe, Anthony Rizzo and Gerrit Cole all contributed to

errors or defensive miscues in the fifth inning, sparking the Dodgers' comeback.

While Judge hit his first World Series homer earlier in the game, his persistent postseason struggles didn't help either.

All season, the captain established himself as the league's MVP while forming baseball's deadliest duo alongside Juan Soto.

While Soto shined in the postseason – at the plate, anyway – Judge mostly crumbled, hitting .167.

With their season ending in sorrow, the Yankees now face an offseason full of question marks.

Aaron Boone is expected to return, so Soto will dominate the team's winter.

Only 26, the superstar is headed for free agency. With figures like \$500 million and \$600 million being thrown around, Hal Steinbrenner will have to pony up if he wants to retain the generational hitter.

At the same time, Steinbrenner has made it known that he wants to keep the payroll under \$300 million next year. With a handful of other veterans potentially hitting the open market – including Gleyber Torres, Clay Holmes, Alex Verdugo and Rizzo – that will require supplementing the roster with younger, cheaper players if Soto is re-signed.

Of course, there's always the possibility that Soto goes elsewhere. He's seemed to enjoy his time in pinstripes, assimilating to the clubhouse, forming a connection with fans, and reveling in the spotlight.

But other high-rollers are going to pursue the Scott Boras client, and Steinbrenner has shown that he has limits.

After coming up short in the World Series, the owner may have to reconsider that approach.

The Yankees must also realize that simply keeping the slugger won't be enough, not after the Dodgers nearly swept them off baseball's biggest stage.

There's no denying that 2024 was a season of immense progress for the Yankees. But as they fell flat in the World Series, it became clear that better isn't good enough.

The Yankees' season ended in disaster on Wednesday, as the Dodgers capitalized on dreadful defense while securing their second championship since 2020.

With Los Angeles celebrating at Yankee Stadium, the Bombers could only blame themselves for a 7-6 loss in Game 5. The Yankees, trying to defy history and a 3-0 series deficit, once led, 5-0, as Aaron Judge, Jazz Chisholm Jr. and Giancarlo Stanton all went deep while Alex Verdugo added an RBI single.

However, the not-so-fundamentally sound team erased that edge with a comedy of errors in the fifth inning, a fitting catastrophe for a club that endured its fair share of lapses in the field

With Enrique Hernández having already sin-

gled, Judge - who made a sensational, crashing catch at the wall in the fourth - dropped a routine ball in center. The Dodgers then loaded the bas-

es when Will Smith reached on an error from Anthony Volpe, who tried for a force out at third but spiked his throw to Chisholm.

Gerrit Cole then recorded two strikeouts, but a squibbed ball off Mookie Betts' bat led to miscommunication between the pitcher, who didn't cover first, and Anthony Rizzo, who didn't show much urgency after fielding the soft grounder.

Still, the Dodgers only had one run after all that, as Hernández scored on the Betts ball.

But with Cole forced to record extra outs, Freddie Freeman lined a two-run single before Yankee killer Teoscar Hernández added a tworun double.

Just like that, the Yankees found themselves tied in a must-win game. Cole, meanwhile, left the mound after 38 pitches and zero earned runs in the fifth frame.

He ended the night with four hits, five runs (none earned), four walks, six strikeouts and 108 pitches over 6.2 innings.

The Yankees were able to retake the lead in the sixth when Stanton provided a go-ahead sac fly, but Tommy Kahnle allowed three straight batters to reach in the eighth, forcing Luke Weaver to enter with the bases loaded and nobody out.

Unable to escape the impossible jam, Weaver surrendered a game-tying sac fly to Gavin Lux before Austin Wells was called for catcher interference with Shohei Ohtani at the plate. Betts then added his own sac fly to give the Dodgers the lead for good.

A few outs later, the L.A. began its party in the Bronx.

With the World Series coming to a quicker close than most envisioned, the Yankees remain championship-less since 2009.

With their fans frustrated by the drought and the team's performance in this year's Fall Classic, the pinstripers must now prepare for an offseason full of question marks. Whether Juan Soto remains with the club is at the top of the list, but the Yankees have several in-house free agents who may have played their final game with the team on Wednesday.

Dominant Cole gets little help from Yankee defense, or his own, as Dodgers spoil night with Series win

In the biggest start of his Yankees career, Gerrit Cole appeared to be on his way to the performance of a lifetime.

With the Yankees facing elimination in Game 5 of the World Series, Cole retired the Dodgers' first eight batters Wednesday night in the Bronx and held the loaded Los Angeles line-up hitless through four innings.

The Yankees led by five runs going into the top of the fifth – but that's when everything turned in their World Series-ending 7-6 loss to the Dodgers.

After Enrique Hernandez led off the inning with a single, Yankees center fielder Aaron Judge dropped a routine fly ball hit by Tommy Edman, putting runners on first and second.

Shortstop Anthony Volpe followed with another error, bouncing a throw to third baseman Jazz Chisholm Jr. on a Will Smith grounder to load the bases with no outs.

Still, Cole nearly escaped the inning unscathed.

He pumped a third-strike fastball past Gavin Lux for the first out.

He fooled a swinging Shohei Ohtani with a nasty knuckle curve for the second out.

And he induced a slow ground ball off the bat of Mookie Betts with a chance to extinguish the scoring threat.

But first baseman Anthony Rizzo didn't charge Betts' cue shot, and Cole stopped running on his way to cover the bag. That allowed the speedy Betts to reach and for the Dodgers' first run to score.

Freddie Freeman then lined a two-run single on a 1-2 fastball, and Teoscar Hernandez followed with a two-run double to center field that soared over Aaron Judge's head.

Just like that, the Yankees' 5-0 advantage turned into a 5-5 tie. All five of those Dodgers' runs were unearned.

The shoddy defense squandered a valiant effort in an elimination game

by Cole, who did not allow an earned run over his 6.2 innings but settled for a no-decision. The right-hander gave up four hits and four walks and struck out six.

He stuck around for five more outs following the Dodgers' error-fueled fifth-inning rally, and the Yankees led, 6-5, when Cole exited with two outs in the seventh inning.

As he walked to the dugout, a sellout Yankee Stadium crowd of 49,263 showered Cole with a standing ovation

It was a show of appreciation for a pitcher who grinded through a roller-coaster season, one that began with a spring-training diagnosis of inflammation and edema in his right elbow.

The reigning American League Cy Young Award winner missed nearly the first three months of the season, and through seven starts, he sported an uncharacteristic 5.40 ERA.

Cole finished strong, pitching to a 2.25 ERA over his final 10 regular-season outings, and he mostly continued that success through the playoffs.

His outing in Game 5 of the World Series lowered his ERA to 2.17 over 29.0 innings this postseason.

He held the Dodgers to one run over six-plus innings in Game 1 in Los Angeles, but in similar fashion as Wednesday, a series of defensive misplays in that game contributed to Cole taking a no-decision and, ultimately, to the Yankees losing that game in extra innings

The Yankees did not consider using Cole on short rest in Tuesday night's Game 4 after falling behind 3-0 in the best-of-seven series, with manager Aaron Boone citing the pitcher's early-season injury as a reason to be continued.

Cole threw 108 pitches on Wednesday after not exceeding 89 in any of his previous four playoff starts.

"I feel great right now," Cole said before Game 5. "I'm available whenever the team wants me to pitch. There's nothing preventing me from pitching if the team wants me to pitch."

Dodgers jump on Yank miscues, pen happy Series ending

There was no punting away Game 5 for the Los Angeles Dodgers. They were always destined.

One night after they failed to clinch a World Series victory at Yankee Stadium, the Dodgers returned to the Bronx up 3-1 on the Yankees in the best-of-seven set, determined to put an end to the coast-to-coast series.

And they promptly fell behind. Gerrit Cole no-hit Los Angeles through the first four innings while the Yankees scored five runs and chased starter Jack Flaherty from the game in the second inning. Los Angeles manager Dave Roberts,

who faced intense scrutiny for his management his relievers in Game 3, had to empty his already empty bullpen.

Ultimately, it proved to nothing more than another hurdle for the Dodgers to overcome. A valiant comeback effort led them to a 7-6 win over the Dodgers Wednes-

day night at Yankee Stadium, and the title of World Series champions.

For the Dodgers to even get to the World Series with only three healthy starting pitchers was remarkable to begin with, but it looked as though the Yankees were going to win the pitching battle of attrition.

But then the Yankees giftwrapped five runs in the fifth inning, making costly errors to load the bases with no outs. The Dodgers tied the game at five, went down 6-5 and then finally, tied the game again in the top of the eighth and pushed another across the plate to take a lead.

Aaron Judge, who finally had a signature World Series moment with a first-inning home run off Flaherty, had an easy play on a fly ball by Tommy Edman with one on and none out, but he closed his glove too soon and the ball bounced right off of it. Anthony Volpe nabbed a ground ball by Will Smith and tried to get the

lead runner, but made a sloppy throw to third to load the bases.

Cole struck out Gavin Lux and Shohei Ohtani and was nearly out of the inning unscathed until an error of sorts of his own. Mookie Betts hit one just beyond the first base bag to Anthony Rizzo, who was slow to make a play and Cole didn't cover first. Betts was safe at first and Kiké Hernandez scored.

Then came Freddie Freeman, who snapped his home run streak but added two RBI to his World Series MVP resume with a tworun single. Teoscar Hernandez cleared the bases with a two-run double and the game was tied.

But it wasn't easy from there. Brusdar Graterol couldn't find

zone and the Yankees took the lead back in the sixth. Blake Treinen bent, but didn't break in 2.1 innings. He was the only reliever left. The Dodgers sent Game 3 starter Walker Buehler to the bullpen.

Roberts had no choice but to manage for today and not Friday.

It was a nail-biter all the way through, but Buehler closed it out. In what was possibly his final time wearing the uniform of the team that drafted him, he retired the Yankees in order in the bottom of the ninth to secure the second World Series title since 2020 for the Dodgers.

Without the super staff the team started the season with, the Los Angeles lineup carried them through. Shohei Ohtani, the best player in the world, disappeared in the series, failing to even record a hit. But the Dodgers won because they didn't build a lineup around one player. They don't rely on Ohtani or Freeman or Betts for the big hit. They constructed a roster that can win in a multitude of ways and a dynamic lineup that can run the bases, use all fields and play multiple defensive positions.

The super team was significantly weakened this month, and yet they're still the last team standing.



Goofball fans who interfered with Betts banned from Series Game 5 at Stadium

The two men who grabbed Dodgers star Mookie Betts' arms during a brazen fan interference Tuesday were banned from Wednesday night's Game 5 of the World Series, the Yankees announced Wednesday.

The fans were ejected from Tuesday's game at Yankee Stadium for what the team described as "egregious and unacceptable physical contact."

"The safety and security of players, fans and Stadium staff is the foundational element of every event held at Yankee Stadium, and it cannot be compromised," the Yankees said in a statement before Wednesday's game.

The incident occurred in the bottom of the first inning of the Yankees' 11-4 win when Gleyber Torres sliced a fastball from Dodgers pitcher Ben Casparius into foul territory.

Betts leaped to make the catch at the wall along the right-field foul line, and one of the fans grabbed the Dodgers star's glove while it was still on his left hand

The other fan then grabbed Betts' right hand as the original fan removed the ball from the glove. Right-field umpire Mark Carlson deemed the play to be fan interference, and Torres was called out.

"There's no place for that," Yankees manager Aaron Boone said Wednesday. "It's as simple as that. Like come here, cheer, root for your team, whatever. No place for that. Should never have hands on anyone. Just not OK."

An NYPD officer who was involved with the fans' ejection told the Daily News the fans were regulars and that he expected them back for Game 5.

But the Yankees announced the ban early Wednesday afternoon, meaning the fans' tickets for Game 5 have been revoked and that the men could not enter the stadium under any circumstances.

Their tickets went to a pediatric cancer patient and his family, a Yankees spokesman said.

"Tonight marks the final home game of [the] year, and we want every ounce of our fans' passion on display," the Yankees said. "Yankee Stadium is known for its energy and intensity, however the exuberance of supporting one's team can never cross the line into intentionally putting players at physical risk."

ESPN identified the fans as season-ticket holder Austin Capobianco and his friend, John Peter.

"We always joke about the ball in our area," Capobianco told ESPN at a nearby bar. "We're not going to go out of our way to attack. If it's in our area, we're going to 'D' up."

The fans will be refunded for their Game 5 tickets, a source told The News. Whether the ban extends beyond Wednesday is still to be determined.

"When it comes to the first-inning play, it doesn't matter because we lost," Betts said after Tuesday's game. "It's irrelevant. I'm fine, he's fine, everything is cool. We lost the game, and that's what I'm kind of focused on: turning the page and getting ready for tomorrow."

It was the second fan interference of the 2024 World Series involving Torres. In the ninth inning of Game 1 in Los Angeles, a fan in Dodgers clothes reached over the left-field wall and caught a deep drive by Torres on the fly.

Torres was credited with a double and did not score in the inning, and the Yankees went on to lose that night, 6-3, on Freddie Freeman's walk-off grand slam in the 10th.

The former Yankee Stadium was the site of a now-iconic fan interference, as then-12-year-old Jeffrey Maier reached over the right-field wall and caught a Derek Jeter drive on the fly in Game 1 of the 1996 ALCS. Jeter was credited with a game-tying home run in an eventual Yankees win – much to the chagrin of the opposing Baltimore Orioles.

Boone hasn't talked future with Yankees

As Aaron Boone prepared for Game 4 of the World Series on Tuesday, his focus was on the unprecedented task in front of him, not the future.

No Fall Classic club has ever overcome a 3-0 deficit, and Tuesday theoretically could have been Boone's last game as Yankees manager. So the skipper was asked about his contract status before the Bombers beat the Dodgers, 11-4, forcing a Game 5.

However, Boone didn't have much of an update to provide.

The 51-year-old, now in his seventh season as Yankees manager, said that he has not talked about his contract status with the team yet. Asked if he expects that to happen soon, Boone said, "I have no idea."

"I'm trying to win a game," he added.

After taking the Yankees to their first World Series since 2009, the expectation is that Boone will return. The Yankees have a club option on him for the 2025 season, and it wouldn't come as a surprise if the two sides discussed an extension.

While Boone received some criticism for some of his pitching decisions in the Yankees' Game 1 World Series loss, the baseball lifer is coming off a pennant, an American League East title and a 94-68 record, the third-best mark in baseball. With a 603-429 overall record, Boone is the seventh-winningest manager in franchise history.

"I'm certainly happy to have him as our manager," Brian Cashman, under contract and also expected back, said of Boone during the

ALDS. The general manager added that the team would address offseason decisions once the offseason began.

Yankees players are also glad to have Boone as their manager.

While he hasn't always been the most popular among fans, Boone has strong support in his clubhouse, starting with Yankees captain Aaron Judge. Others regularly speak out in favor of the manager.

"He takes a lot of heat and keeps firing, keeps going forward," said Giancarlo Stanton, who has also heard his fair share of criticism since joining the Yankees before the 2018 season, Boone's first as manager. "That's why he's one of the anchors for us."

Yanks hope to cash in on Series

When Yankee Stadium hosted Game 1 of the ALCS this month, a fan went viral for bringing a novelty check made out to Juan Soto for \$600 million.

Two weeks later, after Soto's game-winning home run in ALCS Game 5 clinched the American League pennant, the fan returned to Yankee Stadium for Game 3 of the World Series, that time with a check reading \$650 million.

It remains to be seen just how high the bidding will go for Soto, who is expected to command a historic contract during his much-discussed free agency this offseason.

But the Yankees will enter the bidding war with some extra income.

The Yankees' trip to the World Series was good for business. While the exact revenue won't be known for some time, the sports business outlet Sportico estimated before Game 1 that a World Series run would generate about \$70 million in ticket and luxury suite sales alone.

Sportico's projection was based on the Yankees' bond document disclosures dating back to 1997.

Not included in that estimate was the revenue the Yankees will make from selling \$6.99 hot dogs, \$16.29 premium beers, \$64.99 World Series hats or \$119.99 World Series hoodies to sellout crowds of around 49,000 fans during Games 3, 4 and 5.

At face value, World Series tickets at Yankee Stadium this year ranged from \$151 to \$2,115.

By winning Game 4 against the Los Angeles Dodgers on Tuesday night, and thus forcing Wednesday night's Game 5, the Yankees guaranteed themselves even more revenue.

Of course, the Yankees planned to pursue a Soto re-signing long before their playoff run. Soto was a major reason why the Yankees reached the World Series for the first time since 2009.

After the Yankees missed the playoffs last year at 82-80, general manager Brian Cashman traded a five-player package to the San Diego Padres in December to acquire Soto and fellow outfielder Trent Grisham.

Soto, who turned 26 last week, delivered in his first season in pinstripes, slugging a career-high 41 home runs to go with 109 RBI. His .419 on-base percentage ranked second in the majors, while his .988 OPS ranked third. He batted in front of Aaron Judge, whose 58 home runs and 144 RBI led MLB hitters. The Yankees posted the American League's best record at 94-68.

Soto's excellence carried into the postseason, including when he crushed a go-ahead three-run home run in the 10th inning of the Yankees' series-clinching ALCS Game 5 win in Cleveland.

Asked before the World Series if he thought about whether every clutch Soto

hit made his price go up, Yankees manager Aaron Boone replied with a light-hearted, "Not really."

"I want him up there in those spots because I know just how tough his at-bats are, and it seems like the bigger the at-bat, the bigger the moment, he does have a knack for seizing that moment," Boone said. "We've seen it all year, culminating with an at-bat for the ages in the championship series."

The Yankees' payroll for the 2024 regular season was about \$296 million, according to Baseball Prospectus. That included Soto's \$31 million salary.

The expiring contracts of Soto, Gleyber Torres, Alex Verdugo and Clay Holmes add up to more than \$60 million that is coming off the books, and the Yankees hold a \$17 million club option with a \$6 million buyout for Anthony Rizzo as well.

But Soto, a five-time All-Star who appears poised for his fifth 10-top finish in MVP voting, could command a payday exceeding \$500 million, or even \$600 million, in total value.

The Mets – whose owner, Steve Cohen, has a net worth of \$21.3 billion, according to Forbes – are heavily rumored to be interested, while the deep-pocketed Dodgers are known star-chasers whose heavily deferred \$700 million contract for Shohei Ohtani could help them add another stud in the immediate future.

GET OFF TO FAST START

The Jets have only scored three points on their opening drives this season through eight games. Against a team like the Texans, the Jets need to get off to a fast start at home. In Sunday's loss to the Patriots, Gang Green's offense looked unprepared and spent three timeouts in the first quarter. The team also took a delay of game penalty on a two-point conversion in the fourth quarter. The Jets will have their hands full trying to slow down a Texans defense that's second in the league in yards (280.3) allowed and third in sacks (27). Houston is also eighth in pressure rate

ESTABLISH GROUND GAME

The Jets averaged four yards per carry on Sunday. However, Gang Green strangely went away from the run in the second half. With Aaron Rodgers hobbled by injuries to his knee and hamstring, running backs Breece Hall and Braelon Allen must make a significant impact against a stout Texans defense. Houston's defense has allowed 116 rushing yards per game, which is 13th in the league. However, during last weekend's game against the Colts, the Texans allowed 163 yards on the ground. Indianapolis also averaged 6.3 yards per rushing attempt. The more the Jets can run the football, the less pressure will be on Rodgers and the passing game

GET PRESSURE ON STROUD

In last year's 30-6 victory against the Texans, the Jets harassed QB C. J. Stroud and sacked him four times. He completed just 10-of-23 passes for 91 yards. He also left the game with a concussion in the fourth quarter. Gang Green's defensive line must consistently pressure Stroud to force potential turnovers. Houston will be without WR Stefon Diggs, who tore his ACL and will miss the rest of the season. If the Jets can contain RB Joe Mixon, who is averaging 100.6 yards per game, that will give Quinnen Williams, Haason Reddick and Will McDonald more opportunities to force Stroud into third-and-long situations



Knowing every game

The term "must-win game" might be the most overused cliché in sports.

But in this case it does accurately describe the situation the Jets (2-6) face ahead of tonight's game against the Texans (6-2) at MetLife Stadium.

After beginning the season 2-1, the Jets have lost five consecutive games. They now find themselves in a desperate state in the season's final nine games.

"I know for Jet fans, I know this season is probably crazy watching this," cornerback D.J. Reed said. "I know the talent of this team, it doesn't make sense. I know that's how the fans feel. They are probably flabbergasted.

"My mindset and my perspective on life is to finish whatever I start. Right now, we are 2-6, which is horrible. It's horrible. But my mindset, I feel like we can still win out, which might sound crazy to a lot of people but that's how I approach it. I feel like we can still win out because we have the team to do so. Does everyone feel like that? I don't know, but that's how I feel. Obviously, we can't lose, but I still feel like it is possible to make this right. It starts with winning this Thursday night game."

Win out is what the Jets might have to do to keep their playoff dreams alive.

Beginning the season 2-6 has historically been the kiss of death for NFL teams. In the Super Bowl era, which started in 1966, only three teams - the 1970 Bengals, the 2020 Washington squad, and the 2022 Jaguars – have made the postseason after beginning the year with six losses in eight games. Of those three teams, all of them won their respective divisions.

The Jets' chances of winning the AFC East are slim to none. They trail the Bills (6-2) by four games and have already lost the first meeting against Buffalo in Week 6. However, the Jets are only two back of the Chargers in the win column (4-3) for the final wild-card spot in the AFC

But if the Jets are going to make an unprecedented run toward the postseason, it has to start against the Texans tonight. The good news is the last time the Jets had a five-game losing streak, they ended it by crushing the Texans, 30-6, last season.

"I mean, it's always tough, but I think Thursday night, as tough as it is on your body, it's good on the mind because you can just move on," Aaron Rodgers said. "Brick (Jets interim coach Jeff Ulbrich) did a good job of kind of cleaning everything up and then moving on. We hate these games because they're a short week, but we love them because of the weekend. They feel a lot better when you win."

During their five-game losing streak,

the Jets have fired Robert Saleh, traded for Davante Adams and changed offensive play-callers, but the results have remained the same

Gang Green's offense was supposed to improve with Rodgers' return from a season-ending Achilles tear he suffered last season. However, the Jets are 24th in yards (310.6) and 25th in points per game (18.8). Speaking of Rodgers, 40, he has not been 100% after battling an ankle, a knee, and now a hamstring injury, for most of this season. He ranks 23rd in QBR (50.4) and is on pace to record the highest number of interceptions in his career.

"Not as good as I would've hoped," Rodgers said about his performance this season. "I got to play better.

"I just got to be more efficient, not turn the ball over too many times. Interceptions can be misleading at times, but I've definitely had my share of poor throws."

Rodgers and the Jets offense will face a stiff challenge against a Texans defensive line featuring Will Anderson Jr. and Danielle Hunter. These two players have helped the Texans register 27 sacks, which is third in the league.

The Jets' defense has also not performed up to standards. Although it ranks fourth in vards allowed (286.8), it has allowed 27 points per game in its last four games.

The defensive low point of this season came during the final drive in the loss to the Patriots. Gang Green allowed New England to drive 70 yards and score the game-winning touchdown, which included Jacoby Brissett's 34-yard pass to Kayshon Boutte that set up Rhamondre Stevenson's one-yard touchdown run with 22 seconds remaining.

"Energy was obviously the big topic last week," Ulbrich said of the Week 7 loss to the Steelers. "We talked about making sure that the energy was right. I felt the energy was right.

"The preparation last week, and then that carried into the game. What it ultimately came down to was the execution ... and that's something that's on everyone. Not just players, not just coaches, but the collective group.

"We're not executing like we're capable of executing, and until we do that, this thing will not change. So we've got to get better in all that we do when it comes to performing the plays and performing the techniques, performing all the base principals that we know and we own at the deepest level, so that's got to get better.'

Now, the Jets will face C.J. Stroud, who, in just his second year, is already one of the best quarterbacks in the NFL. This year, he has thrown for 1,948 yards, 11 touchdowns and four interceptions.

NEW KICKERS IN PLACE

Jets fans clamoring for a new kicker on social media finally got their wish on Wednesday. Gang Green is signing Riley Patterson and Spencer Shrader to its practice squad.

Either Patterson or Shrader is expected to kick tonight's game against the Texans. The team also placed Greg Zuerlein on injured reserve.

Zuerlein has been the Jets' kicker since 2022 but has struggled this season. He has missed six field goals and two extra points in eight games, compared to only three field goals and one extra point in 16 games last season.

In the Jets' loss to the Patriots on Sunday, Zuerlein missed a 44-yard field goal and an extra point. On Tuesday, Patterson, Shrader, Cade York, Andre Szmyt, Zane Gonzalez and Brayden Narveson all worked out for the Jets at MetLife Stadium.

Also, on Tuesday, Zuerlein was added to the injury report (non-kicking knee) after practicing in a limited capacity. However, Ulbrich did not mention Zuerlein's injury during his media availability.

Patterson started his NFL career with the Lions, hitting 13 of 14 field goals as an undrafted rookie in 2021. The Jaguars claimed Patterson off waivers from the Lions in 2022, and he converted 30 of 35 field goals.

Despite his solid campaign, the Jaguars traded Patterson back to the Lions in 2023. He was eventually waived after missing two extra

points in three games. Following his second stint with the Lions, Patterson has made stops in Cleveland and Washington.

Shrader went undrafted out of Notre Dame this year and eventually signed with the Colts as an undrafted free agent. He was waived and later added to the Colts practice squad before the team released him earlier this month.

In other moves ahead of the game against the Texans, the Jets signed linebacker Marcelino McCrary-Ball to the active roster and released safety Jaylen Key from the practice squad.

Adding McCrary-Ball will give the Jets added depth after C.J. Mosley suffered a neck injury during warm-ups against the Patriots and did not play.



WHEN: 8:15 PM TV: CH. 5 LINE: Texans by 1.5, 42.5 HANK'S HONEYS: It's not a terrible idea to put the Jets in a fade pattern until they prove otherwise. They just aren't to be trusted right now, even if this might smell like a trap game.

Their only two wins have come against two of the worst teams in the league, the Patriots and Titans, while the Texans are nearly as good as anyone they've played, outside of the Vikings and perhaps the Packers.

Neither the Jets offense nor defense impresses, and as far as special teams go, they are working in new kickers. Clearly, the Robert Saleh firing has had an adverse effect on the defense, which is getting worn down trying to bail out the O every game.

Now, it faces one of the NFL's best playmakers in C.J. Stroud. Although Stroud will be missing his top two receivers, Nico Collins and Stefon Diggs, against a strong secondary, he still has Tank Dell and Dalton Schultz as options. The offense also has been fine relying on Joe Mixon. Mixon has been a TD machine when he's healthy and the Jets' run stop unit ranks in the league's bottom third.

Meanwhile, Aaron Rodgers hasn't looked like his old self except for the first Patriots game. Davante Adams hasn't added any explosiveness to the downfield passing attack, and Rodgers doesn't have the legs to make plays out of the pocket as he once did. That lack of mobility will be an issue against a very strong Houston pass rush. The Jets have averaged just 16.6 ppg during a five-game losing streak and, even with Houston banged up at the safety position, they don't have any clear matchup advantages against a defense that ranks second in fewest yards allowed against per game (280.3) and third against the pass (164.3 ypg).

Jayden Daniels' game-winning Hail Mary to Washington Commanders receiver Noah Brown last Sunday was the highlight of the NFL season for the NFC East's first-place

Daniel Jones' primetime Pittsburgh loss was again filled with team-wide lowlights that undercut any positives the last-place Giants might have put on the field.

The fortunes of these two division rivals who seemingly have battled perennially for third place are splintering in opposite directions.

One has a new owner, GM, coach and quarterback, and a new stadium on the way in years to come. The other is stuck in neutral and regressing, with a 2-6 record through eight games for the second straight

"It's not fun," Giants head coach Brian Daboll said after Monday night's 26-18 loss in Pittsburgh. "We work as hard as we can work each week. I believe we do things right. Unfortunately, the results aren't what we want them to be. So we've got to have mental toughness. But [you'd] like to get better results."

The Commanders (6-2) sit in first place coming off Sunday's heroics. The Philadelphia Eagles (5-2) are nipping at their heels after a third straight win and their best offensive performance of the season, 37-17, over the Cincinnati Bengals.

And the Dallas Cowboys (3-4) are teetering after losing two straight to the Detroit Lions and San Francisco 49ers. But they're still in better shape than the last-place

Joe Schoen's and Daboll's Giants are 0-3 already in the NFC East, compared to a 1-0 division record for the Commanders, Eagles and Cowboys

The other three teams have the rest of their division schedule in front of them, which gives them a better chance to shake up the order with head-to-head victories.

But Sunday marks the Giants' fourth of six NFC East games already. They've run out of time, barring a miracle turnaround.

Their failures in the NFC East in many ways are a reflection on the disappointing overall since they took over in 2022, including a 1-10 mark in 11 games against the Eagles and Cowboys.

Washington is the only NFC East team that Schoen and Daboll have had any success against, with a 3-1-1 record in five games. But that includes a 21-18 road loss in Landover, Md., already.

And the Giants' league-worst run defense, which is allowing 5.4 yards per carry to opponents, is the wrong weakness to have against Wash-

ington's Daniels and running backs Brian Robinson Jr. and Austin Ekeler.

Commanders The rushed for 215 yards on the Giants in Week 2, including Robinson's 133 yards at 7.8 yards per carry.

Dexter Lawrence screamed at the Giants defensive backs on the sideline during Monday night's second quarter. And when the defense next came on the field, corner Deonte Banks was benched for the rest of the game.

Lawrence, Brian Burns and the Giants' players vented frustration in the postgame locker room after the Steelers put up 426 yards of offense, the Giants committed 11 penalties as a team and Jones committed turnovers on consecutive drives to end the

"We're a good team, and we keep beating ourselves every week," Lawrence said. "That's where my frustration comes from." Burns didn't mince words.

"This team needs to grow up," he said of a need to be more detailed. "The coaches can say so much. It's the players."

The last time the Giants played at

The Giants are 0-4 at home this season. They have scored 10 total points in their

last two home games and only three points in the first halves of those losses combined to the Eagles and the Bengals.

Jones has not thrown a touchdown pass in MetLife Stadium this season. He has zero touchdowns, four interceptions and one benching.

And if he falters again Sunday, it's not

out of the question that this game could be his

last on this field.

His \$23 million injury guarantee for 2025 will prompt a benching eventually, and a fourth division loss with one game remaining before the bye probably will seal his fate as a Giant - if not the GM's and head coach's, too.



the Knicks would notch a 116-107 victory over his Heat Wednesday night.

These Knicks, Adebayo knew, weren't just retooled

for another deep playoff run. They were built for a title.

They didn't just trade five firstround picks for Mikal Bridges, they followed up by shipping out three-time All-Star Julius Randle and versatile two-way wing Donte DiVincenzo to Minnesota for Karl-Anthony Towns. The moves signaled a shift in the Knicks' aspirations. With Bridges and Towns, the Knicks weren't just content with competing. They were after a championship.

It was Adebayo's job to figure out how to stop Towns, a 39.8% career shooter from deep whose arrival brought a new dynamic to

the Knicks' offense. Gone, due to ankle surgery, was Mitchell Robinson's paint presence. In his place stood Towns, a floor-spacing, three-

point-shooting big man capable of shifting the game's balance.

Adebayo trusted the Heat's defensive schemes under coach Erik Spoelstra, confident in the game plan to contain the versatile Knicks' offense.

"Trust our schemes, trust what we do," Adebayo said. "We come up with great plans on that side of the ball, so for us, it's getting stops, making the shots difficult, and running in transition."

But on this night, trust alone wasn't enough. The Kat was out of the bag, and Miami had no answer.

Towns was unstoppable, pouring in 44 points and grabbing 13 rebounds on 17-of-25 shooting. He set the tone early with 12 points in the first quarter, followed by another 12 in the second, entering the fourth quarter with 30 points on 11-of-18 shooting. After a quiet 13-point outing in Monday's loss to Cleveland, Towns came out aggressive, attempting eight shots in the first quarter alone and leading the Knicks with 25 field goal attempts for the night.

Towns only took eight shot attempts against the Cavaliers, but took eight in the first period alone in Miami.

Towns' scoring explosion was

exactly what the Knicks needed.

The Heat had jumped out to a 32-26 lead after the first quarter, fueled by Tyler Herro's 14 points and three assists on 5-of-6 shooting. While the Knicks managed to hold Jimmy Butler to 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting, Herro's hot hand kept the Heat in control, with the lead ballooning to as much as 13 points.

But the Knicks clawed back. Mikal Bridges, who had struggled early, missing seven of his first nine shots, found his rhythm in the second half, hitting 4-of-7 from the field and finishing with 17 points.

Jalen Brunson, similarly quiet in the first half (1-of-7 shooting), came alive in crunch time, finishing with 22 points and knocking down two key three-pointers in the final stretch: one to give the Knicks a 79-77 lead late in the

third, and another to stave off a Heat comeback in the fourth.

But it was Towns' night from the start. In the game's final minutes, with the Knicks holding a slim lead, he nailed a dagger three from the top of the key to stretch the margin to 12.

Then, in a moment that sealed Miami's fate, Towns muscled his way between Adebayo and Butler to snare an offensive rebound and lay it back in, drawing the foul. He flexed toward the crowd on his way to the line, his dominant performance putting the finishing touches on a Knicks victory.

With the win, the Knicks moved to 2-2. Now, the road awaits: Detroit, Houston, and Atlanta. Three teams, three cities, and each of them about to find out that the Kat is out of the bag and heading their way.

KAT puts Butler drama in past

MIAMI — Karl-Anthony Towns has no interest in revisiting his time with Jimmy Butler as teammates on the Timberwolves.

The tumultuous relationship, which helped end Minnesota's 13-year playoff drought, was marked by fireworks both on and off the court – moments Towns prefers to leave in the past as he prepared for his first matchup against Butler as a Knick.

"I'm here in New York. That's all I'm thinking about right now," Towns said after Wednesday's morning shootaround at the Kaseya Center. "I'm a Knick. You bringing up Minnesota. I'm not a Timberwolf anymore. I'm a Knick."

Despite the history, Towns insisted there was no extra motivation in facing Butler for the first time since their Minnesota breakup. The game also marked the first time Towns, Butler and Tom Thibodeau—who coached them both during that roller-coaster year-and-a-half run—shared the court since Butler's trade to the 76ers in 2018.

"My motivation is to win games. To win basketball games. So that's all I'm really worried about," Towns said. "Trying to get one in the left column. We've gone win, loss, win, loss, so trying to make it a win tonight."

Butler's current co-star, Bam Adebayo, also downplayed any lingering tension between the two former teammates following the Heat's shootaround.

"I don't think (Jimmy) gets fired up for

matchups," Adebayo said. "I think if they start it, that's when it starts, or he'll feel like he'll see something, and he just digs. So I don't think there's any — for him, mentally, I don't think there's anything."

But what could set Butler off?

"I – listen – I just think in a game, he'll see body language or see something small like that," Adebayo said. "And he just goes with it."

For basketball fans, though, it's hard not to bring up the past. Butler and Towns were once expected to lead Minnesota to perennial title contention, but their partnership lasted just a year and a half. After the team made the playoffs with a 47-35 record in 2018, Butler requested a trade, famously skipping practice before showing up later to curse out his teammates in a scrimmage, only to sit down with ESPN's Rachel Nichols soon after to tell his side of the story.

Former Timberwolves point guard Jeff Teague, who was part of the team that snapped Minnesota's playoff drought, shed light on how things quickly unraveled during an episode of his "Club 520" podcast. According to Teague, Butler initially intended to defer to Towns and

Andrew Wiggins, but that plan fell apart after just a few games.

"Jimmy's like (Kat's) the best player. We gonna let him do his thing. Him and Wiggs are gonna carry the team. I'm gonna do everything else. You're gonna run the show, because that ... (Kat is) special," Teague recalled. "About game four, Jimmy said 'f--k this s--t, this ain't gonna work. I thought they were something else. They ain't:"

Towns addressed Teague's comments during an appearance on Paul George's podcast, but made it clear he wasn't there to talk about Butler.

"Much respect to Jimmy. I needed the help to get to my first playoffs. It's a team game and we both did a lot of work to get us there, so shoutout to him. I don't wanna disrespect him," Towns said. "I wasn't raised to disrespect nobody. I'm not a disrespectful kind of man."

Towns also reflected on how he chose to remain silent at the time, despite the criticisms swirling around his relationship with Butler.

"Things happened the way they happened. It is what it is. Could I have said more when I was younger at that point? I could, but I really cared about the organization. I cared about that shield, that logo that we all wear, the NBA logo, and I was only about being a professional," Towns said. "So could I have said something? Could I have said something? Could I have said marratives people paint on me? For sure. But I took the approach of a wise man. A wise man says nothing at all. I took the high road and just worried about playing basketball."

Fresh start lifts Ziaire

New Net delivering from behind the arc

Ziaire Williams has showcased staggering improvement as an outside shooter this season.

The 10th overall pick in the 2021 draft, who was viewed as one of the better shooters in his rookie class coming out of Stanford, shot just 30.1% from 3-point range over his first three seasons with the Grizzlies. Because of his offensive inconsistency, and his inability to stay healthy, Memphis offloaded him to the Nets in July, which gave the 23-year-old the fresh start he desperately needed.

General manager Sean Marks did not have to give up much to acquire Wiliams – just an aging tweener big in Mamadi Diakite, a throw-in from the Mikal Bridges trade with the Knicks, and the draft rights to Nemanja Dangubic, a Serbian forward who was drafted by the 76ers more than a decade ago and will likely never appear in an NBA game.

Marks may have struck gold. Not only is Williams one of the better perimeter defenders on the roster, boasting the second-best defensive rating on the team at 112.1, but the forward has averaged 10.3 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.5 assists in his first four games off the bench while shooting 55.2% from the field and 66.7% from deep — which has made him the Nets' most efficient 3-point shooter so far this season by a mile.

The next closest Net in terms of long-range marksmanship has been Dennis Schröder, who has shot 51.7% from deep through four games. For now, Williams stands alone, and his newfound confidence from behind the arc is opening up the rest of his game. He went 4-of-5 from deep in Tuesday's 144-139 loss to the Nuggets at Barclays Center and finished with a team-high 18 points off the bench. He is off to an 8-of-12 start from distance in 2024-25, the most efficient stretch of his career.

"I definitely feel like I have more to bring to the table, but I'm happy with the start," Williams said. "Definitely not thinking at all out there, just being myself and playing free. It's been good. I've been pushed really hard by all the staff here and that's what I like. So, so fa,r so good. I just have to keep stacking good days."

When asked about the biggest factors behind his long-range resurgence, Williams did not point to anything specific. He has simply been trusting the work he put in over the offseason and has learned to better manage the highs and lows on his journey. His main focus has been bringing a high level of energy to the court whenever coach Jordi Fernandez has called his number.

When young players selflessly buy into that aspect of the game, offensive success tends to follow naturally.

"We need that energy from everybody that plays," Fernandez said. "We played with 10 players (against Denver), and obviously some guys ended up with really high minutes because of overtime. But I'm very happy to see not just Ziaire and Nic (Claxton), but also Jalen Wilson. Those guys were awesome. I think everybody, the bench was great. That's how you make runs, and basketball is a game of runs. So very, very proud of not just the bench, the starting players and the guys that didn't play that supported their teammates."

Williams did credit a few people for his recent shooting improvement. First, he shouted out Grizzlies assistant coach Anthony Carter, an NBA veteran and father of Devin Carter, the 13th overall pick in the 2024 draft. He said Carter taught him how to hop into his shot instead of stepping into it. It has allowed him to achieve greater momentum and flow with his jumper, which has been on full display through the Nets' first four games of this season.

Among others, the forward also credited IMPACT Basketball owner Joe Abunassar, who gave Fernandez his coaching start in the United States. Williams played high school basketball with Abunassar's son, so they have known each other since he was 14 years old.

Abunassar believes Williams has always been a dominant shooter, citing what he has seen from him on the AAU circuit and his massive success in predraft workouts. Williams' recent success is no surprise to Abunassar. Nothing has changed with Williams' shot mechanically, according to him. Williams has just finally found his rhythm at the NBA level, and it is showing.

After his playing career ended, Venable joined the Cubs' front office in September 2017 as a special assistant of baseball operations. He also was on the team's major-league staff for three years, spending two seasons

as the first base coach and one as the third base coach.

MAYE STILL IN PROTOCOL

Patriots rookie **Drake Maye** remained in the NFL's concussion protocol on Wednesday, limiting his ability to practice for New England's game against the Titans on Sunday. If he can't play, **Jacoby Brissett** will start at quarterback.

"(Maye) will throw the ball at times in practice, but he will be limited," Patriots coach **Jerod Mayo** said Wednesday, when the team was required to release its first injury report since Maye took an unpenalized helmet-to-helmet hit in a victory last weekend over the Jets.

"There are people a lot smarter than me, as far as clearing people with concussions," Mayo said. "We'll lean on our medical professionals — and also the NFL league policy — as far as getting him ready to play."

A veteran of five NFL teams over

nine seasons, Brissett started the first five games of the season, going 1-4 before he was replaced by Maye in Week 6. He said he would not approach this week any differently, whether Maye is available or not.



"I always try to prepare like you're the starter. That doesn't change," he said.

BRYCE TO START

Panthers quarterback **Bryce Young** is scheduled to get his second straight start on Sunday against the Saints, who expect to have **Derek Carr** return under center for the first time since Week 5.

Andy Dalton was a full participant in practice on Wednesday, but Carolina coach Dave Canales said he wanted to err on the side

of caution and give Dalton another week to recover from the thumb injury he suffered in a car accident last week.

Dalton will be the team's No. 2 quarterback.

"It really was me taking the decision out of Andy's hands," Canales said. "If you were to ask Andy, 'can you go?' he would tell you yes. But he is a week removed from a thumb injury. I just want to make sure we are putting him out there in the right state and the right framework. And I'm excited for Bryce to have another opportunity to build on the things."

Carr, meanwhile, practiced on Wednesday for the first time since injuring an oblique muscle in a game at Kansas City on Oct. 7.

Saints coach Dennis Allen said Carr was on "a little bit of a pitch count."
